Dad, Boxing and Campaigns

By the time you read this article, the results of the November election will be final, and our Island City, County, State and Nation will enter 2014 under the guidance of some veteran lawmakers along with a few new leaders that will continue to carry on the honor of public service.

It is probably no secret that in addition to being an athlete, I am a sports fan – football, baseball, tennis, cycling, triathlons, skiing, and equestrian activities. However, it was only after my father passed away (and Muhammad Ali was out of the ring), that my love for Boxing really materialized. I remember days when Dad would stand in front of the television and shadow box, swaying left to right so much so that sometimes I thought he might fall.

This recent election reminded me of Dad's boxing dance and the importance of learning how to take punches gracefully, even when they are purposefully low. MESSAGE FROM THE COMMISSIONER

Commissioner Tom Green

Congratulations to everyone elected to the city commission of Wilton Manors in the November 4th election. An unusually large number of residents filed as candidates this year and I believe it was an informative and lively campaign for the candidates, their supporters, and voters. The large number of candidates willing to undergo the election process demonstrates the political involvement and community spirit of the residents of our city.

The president of the Florida League of Cities has appointed me to the FLC's Transportation Legislative Policy Committee for 2014-15. This committee will determine the legislative priorities, involving transportation projects, for the league for the upcoming legislative session. The committee has been meeting for the last two months and has decided that how transportation funding is spent and "cars-for-hire" are its two priorities for this year. We expect that bills will be filed on both topics.

The FLC wants local input in how transportation funding is spent. This is done in Broward County through the Metropolitan Planning Organization but smaller urban and rural communities do not have this advantage. The "cars-for-hire" priority results from the evolution of car services such as Uber and Flyte. There are virtually no state or local regulations for these companies because they are technically not a car service but "a social online group". If you wish a ride you simply contact Uber and it connects you with a driver who wishes to provide a ride for a fee. The rides must be obtained through the Uber app and the payment must be paid for (when you agree to accept the ride) with a preregistered credit card. There are no cash payments. Prices are determined by Uber based on location and demand. Rates may be higher at night or at times of high demand such as during special events. Sometimes they are more expensive than a taxi and other times less. Uber says that its drivers must have insurance and background checks but many cities would like to have the ability to regulate minimum standards in these areas as well as what type of driver license is used. Cities that have airports that are bonded for their construction may be hurt when Uber drivers are not paying a franchise fee to help support these bonds. Fort Lauderdale and Wilton Manors currently have these ride-sharing services available.

Another transportation topic that I will be tracking this legislative session is one that will require cities that have parking meters on state highways to begin sharing that revenue with the State of Florida. This revenue currently goes into a designated parking fund for Wilton Manors. It can ONLY be used to improve parking in the city and the loss of any of it would be a serious blow to these plans.

ULTRA-LOW FLOW TOILET REBATE PROGRAM

Over 30% of indoor residential water use can occur through the toilet. To help residents reduce water use, the City of Wilton Manors is offering rebates on ultra-low flow (1.28 gallons/flush or lower) WaterSense® certified and labeled toilets. This water conservation program is aimed at encouraging property owners to replace their high water use toilets with new ultra-low flow toilets. Replacement toilets must be models approved by the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) WaterSense® Program which assures that toilets meet stringent performance standards. Funds are extremely limited and are offered on a first-come, first-served basis.

BULK TRASH PICKUP

Please be aware that the City provides once a month bulk trash pickup for residential customers and twice yearly for condo/townhome customers, according to the bulk schedule contained in every issue of the Town Crier. (The schedule is also available on the City's website at: www.wiltonmanors.com.)

Bulk trash includes items such as furniture, appliances and other materials not suitable for normal loading into packer-type vehicles. Bulk collection is not intended for hazardous chemical waste, automobile parts, major construction debris, or trash resulting from commercial landscaping or lawn service transported to a residential unit from elsewhere. Also, mirrors, glass table tops, window panes, plate glass, etc., will not be picked up unless they are properly and safely placed in a rigid container to prevent unnecessary accidents. The placing of these items unsatisfactorily at the curb represents a serious threat of injury to the employees from Waste Management.

The City asks that residents place bulk items out for pickup only during the designated week. Placing items out too early could result in fines. Especially during hurricane season, it is important to ensure that unsecured materials are not left at the curb any longer than necessary in case a storm arrives.

Thank you for your assistance in keeping the City of Wilton Manors a clean and safe environment for its residents. Please see below for a detailed list of upcoming Bulk Trash pickup dates.

WILTON MANORS HISTORICAL SOCIETY LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

The Wilton Manors Historical Society wants to keep history alive at the Willingham Carriage House at Richardson Historic

Park and Nature Preserve. The Society has embarked on a Restoration and Re-Purposing effort for the Carriage House and launched a fund raising campaign. The IRS has granted the Society 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status so donations are deductible to the fullest extent of the law.

“Fixing” an historic building is delicate and expensive. The total cost will be about \$165,000. So far, the Society has contributed almost \$47,000, and the City has budgeted \$42,500 for use in FY 2015. The Society anticipates a need for an additional \$30,000 to bring the facility to its full potential. The Society needs your help with the fund raising campaign.

Founded in 1975, the Historical Society is an all-volunteer organization that is passionate about the City’s future and how preserving and honoring the past can enrich the community for years to come.

When the City acquired the Richardson property in 2002, the focus was on the Manor House and the Park. The little white building next to the parking lot, the Carriage House, has not been living up to its potential as a facility that the public could enjoy. Fears over its structural integrity, as well as building code issues, had relegated it to use for storage only.

Wilton Manors developer E.J. Willingham built the Carriage House in 1925 and used it to support his nursery and estate. It served Wilton Manors mayor Perry Mickel’s farm and George Richardson’s golf course at the site. The City Commission has designated the entire Park as a Historic Landmark. In partnership with the City, the

building has been stabilized and brought to a point where it is poised to add significant value to the Park. Historic preservation experts have helped on every step so that its historical integrity has been maintained and it remains eligible for future preservation- grants or recognition.

NEW AMENITIES

There will be an outside bar on the south side of the building, including a sink and electric service, and an ADA ramp. There will be a new door from the bar into the “catering preparation” area.

The “Caterer Friendly” food preparation area, designed with the help of actual caterers, will allow them and families to serve beverages and hot food easily and efficiently at outdoor parties as well as events in the corporate pavilion. It will have stainless steel counter tops, a warming oven, microwaves, and a big refrigerator.

The main room will have wall fans and a new double door on the south wall for access to the patios of the Manor House. There will be a courtyard on the north side of the building for tables and chairs. Long-term, we would like a pavilion for shade.

HISTORICAL SOCIETY FUND RAISING PROGRAM

The City supports the Society’s efforts to “re-purpose” the city-owned building and has been very cooperative and helpful. Rental revenues will go to the City. The City has done well obtaining grants for a number of large projects in town, but grants for historic restoration are very competitive and difficult to get. 

NEW BOOKS AT THE LIBRARY

The Innovators by Walter Isaacson's

Following his blockbuster biography of Steve Jobs, *The Innovators* is Walter Isaacson's revealing story of the people who created the computer and the Internet. What were the talents that allowed certain inventors and entrepreneurs to turn their visionary ideas into disruptive realities? What led to their creative leaps? Why did some succeed and others fail? In his masterly saga, Isaacson begins with Ada Lovelace, Lord Byron's daughter, who pioneered computer programming in the 1840s. 



YOU CAN HELP REDUCE WATER POLLUTION!

A message from your City's Emergency Management/Utilities Department

Wherever you live, your daily activities could end up polluting Florida's water. Pollutants from homes are major contributors to the pollution of Florida's ground and surface water. These household pollutants travel by rain or irrigation into the state's waters. Take a look around your home and you may find several sources of pollution, such as:

- Automotive and lawn equipment oil and grease leaking on paved areas, or improper disposal of used oil and other products into storm drains
- Runoff of pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers from lawns and gardens
- Organic contaminants from litter, yard trash, sludge, and garbage cans

How do these pollutants impact our waters? Nutrients from fertilizers and animal waste enter our waters and cause excessive growth of algae and aquatic weeds. Sewage, garbage and litter reduce oxygen in the water to levels that can kill aquatic life. Pesticides can kill aquatic organisms and contaminate sediments.




