Resident's Parking Permit Program Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Residential Parking Permit?

The Residential Parking Permit is a pilot program that provides Wilton Manor's residents with easier access to Wilton Drive with this permit. Wilton Manors residents are able to park free at **city-owned/operated parking lots**.

Where can I park with the Residential Parking Permit?

- **City owned and operated parking lots ONLY:**
 - Richardson Park, 1937 Wilton Drive
 - City Hall/Hagen Park, 2020 Wilton Drive
 - NE 8th Terrace, corner of NE 26th Street and NE 8th Terrace
 - Sushi Rock, 2199 Wilton Drive
 - 23@23, NE 11th Avenue at NE 23rd Drive

Please note there are a few private parking lots just off The Drive. These lots are not included.

How much is the Residential Parking Permit?

For the pilot period, March 1 – December 31, 2021, the cost will be \$50. If fully implemented on January 1, 2022, the Residential Parking Permit will cost \$60.00 per year. This is equivalent to parking for 3.5 hours once a month for twelve months. ($\$1.50 \text{ per hour} \times 3.5 \text{ hours} = \$5.25 \times 12 \text{ months} = \63.00)

Is my permit valid during special events?

The Residential Parking Permit is not valid when special event parking is in effect. Special events include, but are not limited to, Wicked Manors and the Stonewall Street Festival and Parade. Permit holders will be responsible for finding alternative parking arrangements, or pay the special events parking fee.

Will I be issued a decal?

Yes, you will be issued a decal for your front window.

What documentation is required to apply for a Residential Parking Permit?

A current Florida driver's license and vehicle registration that indicates you live within the City of Wilton Manors are required to apply for a permit. *Please note the addresses on license and vehicle registration must be the same.*

Do you have to be a City of Wilton Manors resident to be eligible for the Residential Parking Permit?

Yes, you must be a Wilton Manors resident and provide proof of City residency.



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May I loan/give my parking permit to someone else to use?

No. The resident's parking permit is tied to a specific vehicle and its license plate number. If the license plate on the car does not match the license plate associated with the permit, the car will be ticketed.

I have multiple cars. Can I purchase more than one permit?

Yes, you may purchase a permit for each one of your vehicles. Remember the addresses on the vehicle registration for each vehicle and on your Florida driver's license must be a Wilton Manors address and the addresses must match.

Can I park anytime with my permit?

No, permits are only valid during normal hours of operation in the City owned/operated parking lots. Overnight parking is prohibited.

How do I apply for a Residential Parking Permit?

Do I still need a permit if I have a disabled placard or license plate?

If you park in an accessible parking space you will need a disabled parking placard or license plate. As per Florida statute 316.1964, drivers of vehicles displaying a disabled parking permit or license plate are allowed to park for free up to four hours in any on-street metered space, unless signage posted restricts the time to park. For example, if the signage establishes a three-hour limit, then you would be allowed to park for a maximum of three hours.
